*Zurich/Innsbruck, 1<sup>st</sup> September 2010* – **ATP Architects and Engineers has incorporated the Swiss architectural office kfp architekten ag into the ATP group and the two companies will now join together in the future operation of the Zurich office.**

In summer 2009, ATP and kfp architekten ag established a joint venture and, since 1st August 2010, kfp has been part of the ATP Group operating as ATP kfp Architekten und Ingenieure AG. The current Managing Director **Alfred Wegmann**, together with **Robert Kelca**, of ATP Innsbruck, will continue to manage operations in Zurich and develop an ATP Integrated Design Office with a full team of architects and engineers.

“The result of the integration of our company into the ATP Group is that we both strengthen ourselves and ensure that we have an exciting future, said Alfred Wegmann. “Together with ATP we can now undertake the next step in the development of ATP kfp Architekten und Ingenieure AG. I look forward enormously to this challenge and to our future together.”

## About kfp architekten ag

The Zurich-based architectural office is notable for its many years as a leading expert in the area of **residential building**. In addition to this, the company has experience in the **health, tourism and office sectors**. kfp was founded in 1962 as “Kuhn & Stahel”. In 1988 the office became a limited company under the name of “Kuhn Fischer Partner Architekten AG” and went on to win a number of important competitions for residential and commercial buildings in and around Zurich. In 2007, Managing Directors Alfred Wegmann and Walter Fischer decided to change the name to “kfp architekten ag”.

> Projects by kfp include the ZKB Steinfels (image), a commercial building for the Zürcher Kantonalbank in the Josefstraße in Zurich comprising 18,000m<sup>2</sup> of offices and 16 apartments (Competition 1st Prize, 2004). kfp was awarded the 1995 City of Zurich Prize for Good Building for another competition winning scheme – the five storey “Brahmshof” residential building in Zurich. The major Limmatwest project, a residential, office and commercial complex, was also the result of a competition winning project and was completed in 2002 (image).

> The team is currently working on residential projects including the Kleeweidhof in Zurich, Husmatten in Stallikon and Curtis Fluentis in Cham bei Zug (image). In addition to this, ATP kfp is designing a large-scale refurbishment of the University Hospital in Zurich (the Eastern Ward Building is currently under construction) and the Hawa Industrial Building in Mettmenstetten. ATP kfp Architects and Engineers currently has around 20 employees.
